Secretary General for the Security Affairs at GCC, Huzaa Al-Hajiri said that the exhibition had witnessed a great progress in many ways, particularly with respect to increasing the number of security companies, which aims to maintain security in the light of the big challenges in the region, particularly the crimes of drug trafficking and money laundering, and other forms of organized crime.

The Director of Gen. Directorate of Traffic Brig. Muhammad al Kharji viewed that the exhibition is an opportunity to learn about the latest technology. The Director Gen. of the Gen. Directorate of Criminal Investigation Brig. Khalifa al Noami stated that the expo features the latest security agencies around the world that are related to internal security, which stimulates a lot of countries around the world to share or access to the types of devices offered and make deals on devices that are compatible and useful in its security.

The Director of Coast and Borders Security Dept. Staff Brig. (Naval) Ali Ahmad al Bodaid emphasized that the Milipol Qatar is one of the most important security exhibitions in the region by a large turnout from the world's leading companies and is a good opportunity to see the latest products of the specialized companies in the world. He pointed out that the department was keen to participate in each edition of the expo to exhibit its latest manufactured boats.

Agreements between Qatar, France and Azerbaijan



In the presence of H.E the Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Abdullah bin Nasser bin Khalifa Al-Thani and French Interior Minister H.E Bernard Cazeneuve, a letter of intent was signed between Qatar and France by the Director General of Public Security H.E Staff Maj. Gen. Saad bin Jassim al Khulafi and the Director General of French National Police H.E. Jean Marc Falcone.

After the agreement signing ceremony, H.E. Staff Maj. Gen. Saad Al Khulafi said that the letter of intent is associated with training, cooperation, mutual understanding and exchange of information in the field of security between the two countries. There are memorandums of security understandings signed between two sides since 1986 and this one aims at the activation of those agreements and it represents the legal framework for organizing cooperation and coordination between two countries in the security field and it will enhance the performance of security personnel and efficiency of security devices in performing the entrusted duties.

A cooperation agreement also was signed between the Internal Security Force (Lekhwiya) and the French Gendarmerie.

It was signed by Brig. Fahd Rashid Al Ali, Director of the Office of the (Lekhwiya) Commander and Director General of the French National Gendarmerie Gen. Denis Favier.

In a statement after the signing ceremony, Brig. Fahd Rashid Al Ali said that the agreement signed today comprises the fields of security cooperation between Qatar and France and this is in addition to our previous agreements in the related fields. Today's agreement focuses on cooperation in the fields of security, especially in the aspect of training and improving technical capabilities in some security fields.

The third agreement was signed with the Azerbaijan by HE Staff Major General Saad bin Jassim Al Khulafi and the Interior Minister of Azerbaijan H.E. Col. Gen. Ramil Usubov. Talking about the agreement, head of agreements section at International Cooperation Department of the Mol Brig. Hadi Al Shahwani pointed out that today's agreement covers cooperation in all security fields such as drug prevention, police training in all fields and exchange of information.

The fourth agreement was signed between (Lekhwiya) and the Ministry of

Emergency Situations of the Azerbaijan. The agreement was signed for Lekhwiya by Brig. Fahad Rashid Al Ali and on Azerbaijani side by H.E Colonel General Kamaladdin Heydarov. Briefing about the agreement, Brig. Al Ali said that the agreement is related with training and exchange of expertise in the security field as the Internal Security Force at present has accomplished an advanced position in the field of training and high efficiency that qualified Lekhwiya to become a member of Association of European and Mediterranean Gendarmeries (FIEP) group in which France, Italy, Portugal, Spain, Jordan, Morocco, Chili and Qatar are members. The membership of Qatar in this group has urged many countries to ask for cooperation with Qatar in this field.

On his part, the Azerbaijani Minister for Emergency Situations H.E Col. Gen. Kamaladdin Heydarov emphasized that the security agreement will enhance the cooperation in exchanging expertise related with emergency and calamities, either of natural or of human mistakes and through this agreement, we are looking for improving cooperation between two friendly countries in all fields.
